## A little history from cottage country...



### **Miss Buzz is described in this passage of the book *Island Odyssey*, page 144:**

*“These three (Croswell Bros. launches) have now passed into history, but a fourth is still running today. The Miss Buzz, owned by Elmer Phillips, was built in 1934 and given the nickname of Mr. Phillips’ daughter Debbie. For those who remember the other three boats, the Miss Buzz is considered the queen of her breed. Unlike the other three, ‘the Buzz’ has mahogany decks with oak trim that Mr. Phillips keeps so beautifully polished you can see your reflection in her gleaming varnished decks. Typical of the ‘cheese cutters’ of her day, the Miss Buzz gracefully slices through the waves instead of pounding over them as modern hulls do. What she lacks in speed she more than makes up in elegance and style, reminiscent of a day when getting there was at least half the fun.”*
